PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Planning Inspectorate Appeal

Following on from our update in the December edition of the Crier regarding the Planning Inspectorate Appeal hearing on 17th January 2024 at 10am in NWBC Council Offices in Atherstone (copy of December Crier available on website). We understand that the Inspector has indicated that the hearing may extend into the 18th January if there is insufficient time on the 17th to undertake a site visit.

Get Daw Mill Green

The Parish Council has written to the Planning Inspectorate supporting enforcement action being taken by Warwickshire County Council against the owners of Daw Mill for failure to implement site restoration measures as part of their planning conditions. The current site is derelict and the owners have failed to undertake measures to ensure the site is safe and also accessible to the public to visit a miners memorial garden. Councillors have requested that the Planning Inspectorate uphold the enforcement action at their hearing on 22nd January.

Wall by Village Green

The Parish Council is awaiting a report from a Structural Engineer and as an interim measure has put in place some safety warning signage to deter pedestrians from walking alongside the wall. We are also awaiting an Arborist report on the trees that are uprooting the wall and causing it to tilt towards the road, along with recommendations of what action the Parish Council should consider taking with regards to the trees going forwards.

Neighbourhood Plan

The Parish Council is continuing to work with NWBC to finalise the draft Neighbourhood Plan and it is hoped that this will shortly be presented to the Planning Board for consideration. At its December meeting the Parish Council approved some final minor amendments to the Plan.

Path to Playing Fields

The Parish Council has now successfully obtained three quotations for the excavation of land and installation of new pathway to the playing fields,

giving a more pedestrian friendly access to the field and making it easier for families to push buggies etc... A grant application has now been submitted to cover the majority of the costs of this project.

Meeting with Warwickshire County Highways

Councillors will be meeting with Council Officers from Warwickshire County Highways to highlight the many areas within the parish where there are concerns. This will include the speed limit on the Kingsbury Road, White Horse traffic lights, speed limit on Farthing Lane and measures around area of school, mis-use of the one way system in Beehive Lane and also poor signage and visibility for motorists coming out of Curdworth to Hams Hall island/A446.

Curdworth events

The Parish Council would like to formally thank Severn Trent Water for once again providing the Village with a Christmas Tree, The Beehive Pub for supplying electricity and also Curdworth Events Committee volunteers who once again organised Christmas activities for residents. The volunteers work tirelessly throughout the year to organise a range of events, and would love to hear from any residents who can help in anyway. Also any support with funding and donations would be greatly appreciated – the Parish Council is looking to support next years activities with some new Christmas Lights.

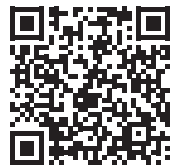
